### Thought for the Day

Today's psalm tells everyone to joyfully sing praises to God, and the hymn writer Fanny Crosby did just that for the whole of her long life. Although she was blind from babyhood, she wrote thousands of hymns which encouraged and inspired people not only in her native America, but also across the world. Her words reached an invalid in a Worcestershire rectory, the English hymn writer Frances Havergal, who was also able to inspire countless people with her hymns such as "Take my life and let it be." Two women who used their gift of words to touch the hearts of Christians around the world. Fanny Crosby's hymn encouraging us all to Praise the Lord! brought people to a renewed Christian commitment during the Billy Graham crusades, and still continues to bring us to our feet to praise God.
