HAVE YOU EVER LOOKED IN AWE AT OUR CHURCH WINDOWS?

This is the front cover of the book which we have created to bring knowledge about the beautiful stained glass windows in the church to a wider audience. For the first time it assembles what is known about these windows by Morris & Co. It contains stunning colour photography, revealing details impossible to see from floor level. As well as being a comprehensive account of the windows it contains an architectural history of the church, a short history of Morris's involvement with stained glass and a theological commentary on the windows. Supported by the Heritage Lottery Fund, it costs £10, is an informative tribute to All Saints and will make an excellent Christmas present. We hope to



have copies on sale first at the Christmas Tree Festival on 7 & 8 December.

OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD SHOE BOX GIFTS - 2019

We are delighted to announce that:- 238 gift-filled shoe boxes have been collected this year! This follows the 3 'Wrap & Fill / Drop Off' coffee mornings held at All Saints Church and the Library, and with the wonderful support of our local community, including Chacombe, who dropped gift-filled boxes and goodies into the The Butler's Pantry, Co-op Store, Co-op Chemist and McIntyers Estate



Agents. We find out soon which country our boxes get sent to, where the children in need will be delighted to receive their gifts (probably their first ever gifts for any Christmas or birthday) and know they are remembered this Christmas. Massive thanks to our many contributors and helpers for their support and time to produce these boxes of fun, including: the wonderful knitters and sewers of bags, glove puppets, hats, gloves, wrist warmers and scarves; the box wrappers, fillers and card writers; everyone who made their own shoe boxes of fun; for the donated goodies and cash donations; the coffee makers and cake bakers; the drop-off points listed above. The Coffee and Cake Mornings held during the 'Wrap & Fill' sessions were enjoyed by all who visited, they helped towards raising the vital funds needed to pay the distribution costs of £5.00 per box. £441.56 has been forwarded to Samaritan's Purse to help pay those costs they incur when processing and sending our 'Wrap & Fill' boxes to the children (this is in addition to cash, cheques and online payments people made to cover these costs for sending their own boxes). A grand total of 2709 filled shoe boxes have been sent to needy children during the 16 years our church and the local community have supported this appeal. Let's get ready for next year! Please start collecting through the year. We need lots of fun toys, small soft toys, toiletries (*NO liquids, toothpaste or sweets*), school supplies and empty shoe boxes (12" x 7" x 5" ideal size), please.
