## For those who worship at home; on Bible Sunday (23<sup>rd</sup> October 2022)

He went to Nazareth, where he had been brought up, and on the Sabbath day he went into the synagogue, as was his custom. He stood up to read, and the scroll of the prophet Isaiah was handed to him. Unrolling it, he found the place where it is written: **"The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favour."** Then he rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the attendant and sat down. The eyes of everyone in the synagogue were fastened on him. He began by saying to them, "Today this scripture is fulfilled in your hearing." **Luke 4:16 - 21**

## Thought for the day

Today is Bible Sunday and in one of the readings set for the day we find Jesus reading from the book of Isaiah in the synagogue, in his home town of Nazareth, to his fellow Jews. For Jesus to say that the scripture that he read, is fulfilled in him would have been shocking to his listeners. They may have expected a saviour but not one who would proclaim God's radical inclusion of **all** in his plans for the salvation of the world.

We, though, have many New Testament scriptures to show that Jesus did indeed fulfil this prophesy, he did all that was prophesied and more, and he calls us to do the same. We are invited to see the power of God's word at work in the world and the church, for the salvation of the whole of creation **and to be part of it**. Will you meet someone this week who is poor in spirit and needs to know God's love? Or who is in a prison of fears and anxieties and needs release, or who does not see their need of God, or is oppressed by worldly care? Jesus says whatever we do for another we do for him (Matthew 25: 40). As our hymn today says, God's Spirit is in our hearts and he will equip us for everything that comes our way.

Blessed Lord, who caused all holy Scriptures to be written for our learning: help us so to hear them, to read, mark, learn and inwardly digest them that, through patience, and the comfort of your holy word, we may embrace and for ever hold fast the hope of everlasting life, which you have given us in our Saviour Jesus Christ, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. **Amen**
