THE OLD TESTAMENT READING is taken from Habakkuk 1 v. 1 - 4 & 2 v 1 - 4

The oracle that the prophet Habakkuk saw. O Lord how long shall I cry for help and you will not listen? Or cry to you 'Violence!' and you will not save? Why do you make me see wrongdoing and look at trouble? Destruction and violence are before me; strife and contention arise.

I will stand at my watch-post, and station myself on the rampart; I will keep watch to see what He will say to me, and what he will answer concerning my complaint. Then the Lord answered me and said; Write the vision; make it plain on tablets, so that a runner may read it. For there is still a vision for the appointed time; it speaks of the end, and does not lie. If it seems to tarry, wait for it; it will surely come, it will not delay. Look at the proud! Their spirit is not right in them, but the righteous live by faith.

THE HOLY GOSPEL is taken from Luke 17 verses 5 - 10

The apostles said to the Lord, "Increase our faith!" The Lord replied, "If you had faith the size of a mustard seed, you could say to this mulberry tree, "Be uprooted and planted in the sea", and it would obey you.

Who among you would say to your slave who had just come in from ploughing or tending sheep in the field, "Come here at once and take your place at the table?" Would you not rather say to him, "Prepare supper for me, put on your apron and serve me while I eat and drink; later you may eat and drink?" Do you thank the slave for doing what was commanded? So you also when you have done all that you were ordered to do, say, "We are worthless slaves; we have done only what we ought to have done!"

This is the Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you O Christ

ADDRESS

As I write this last address, I am reading from the new Bible given to me by the congregation at All Saints Middleton Cheney. It is beautiful, leather bound with gold edging on the pages. I am deeply grateful to have it and thank those who chose it for me very much.

However the Old Testament reading is from one of the lesser known books of Hebrew Scripture. It is a powerful book about God's will for the world, set in the midst of a war against the Chaldeans in the late seventh century. The prophet asks God the question, "Where is God when the world is in trouble?" He asks this as a person of deep faith, constant prayer and intimate communion with God. This does not stop him having an honest conversation with God!

The prophet is frustrated, just as we are today, over a world in trouble and over his own helplessness. He is persistent in seeking an answer saying that he will watch from his tower on the city wall. And God's answer comes but is brief. He assures Habakkuk that his waiting on God will not be in vain, but wait he must, even if the vision of peace and order is a long time coming. So for us today, when we think that God is indifferent, we are asked to see that He may be involved in a way that we don't recognise. There is no simple solution here to the world's problems, but there is a message for faithful believers. We must "live by faith" which will give us strength to continue. We must hang on to the vision that in time will come from God.

The link with the Gospel is that Luke reminds us of the gap between us and God and our need for humility before Him. Humility shaped the lives of Jesus first disciples. They lived with a faith that ultimately changed the world but they remained in obedient humility before Jesus. When they ask Him to increase their faith, Jesus replies with a visual challenge, urging them to contemplate the seemingly impossible. The mulberry tree was especially resistant to uprooting, with some of the deepest roots, but they were challenged to believe that God can do it through them. The power of faith, like the smallest of seeds, does not come from its great size, but from its ability to trust and believe. And we know that a band of disciples chosen to tell the world about Jesus did achieve the impossible. No corner of the world, including our own, is outside the knowledge of Jesus and His eternal promises.

Jesus describes His disciples as slaves and this was probably shocking for them, as it may be when we apply the word to ourselves. But when we freely choose to serve Him, He promises us liberation and a life that is real. The gap between us and God still allows us to achieve the impossible, but it only happens if we submit to Him. So we go on praying that in our time, He will choose to break down the barriers of unbelief in the power of His Love.
